### RIDE SAFELY

Since I was a child, I have always been a lone rider. Even when my daughter started riding, I would ride with her, but when I wanted to "condition" I would go out alone. There never seemed to be riders who wanted to do the work I was doing, in preparing for competitive trail riding. In later years Char and I didn't seem to have the same schedules to allow us to ride together very often. Because of this, I have learned to take precautions while riding alone.

The first major item was to leave a note on our blackboard in the barn as to where I was going, and when I expected to be back, or at least, when I left. In this way, if I didn't turn up they would know which direction to come to find me. After the advent of cell phones, I always carried one with me. I figured even if I couldn't get service where I was at the time, I could get to a high point and hopefully get service there. I also carried a "spare tire", a hoof boot, in case the horse lost a shoe and I needed to walk him home.

I've also carried a fanny pack with several items enclosed. I'm pleased

to say that most of these things I've never had to use: a whistle, a knife, a compass, a package of shoe laces, a roll of Vet wrap, a menstrual pad, or gauze pads, band aids, a large bandana, and more recently, since I'm getting less nearsighted, a folding set of eye glasses. I've known some riders who even add a solar blanket, and/or a large garbage bag, to use as a raincoat

The horse and how confident he is makes a great difference in whether you ride alone or not. I would expect that riders would gauge how far they should travel alone with that particular horse. If your horse is young, or inexperienced, you should always ride in company. Most green horses enjoy the company and the reassurance of a seasoned trail horse.

My safety suggestion: When riding alone take precautions to let others know when and where you're riding. Keep firstaid supplies with you and know how to use them, for both people, and horses. Don't deviate from your ride plan, and try to keep in an area where you can phone, or whistle









### **Umbilical Infections**

#### Introduction

Umbilical infections, also called omphalitis or omphalophlebitis, and are an inflammation of any one of the structures that make up a foal's belly button. The umbilicus consists of two arteries, a vein, and the urachus. The umbilical arteries carry deoxygenated blood away from the fetus and returns the blood to the placenta. The umbilical arteries give rise to the round ligaments of the bladder in the adult. The umbilical vein brings oxygenated and nutrient-rich blood to the fetus from the maternal circulation. In the adult the umbilical vein becomes the round ligament of the liver. The urachus is a remnant of the canal that drains the fetus' bladder.

#### **Diagnosis**

Diagnosis can be made by physical exam and palpation of the umbilicus but not always. External signs (heat, pain, swelling, purulent discharge) may or may not be present. In some cases, an infected umbilicus is only suspected because the foal has a fever without another obvious cause or has a swollen joint. Serum amyloid A and fibrinogen, two markers of inflammation in the blood, are usually elevated. The gold standard for diagnosis is enlargement of one or more of the structures on ultrasound. Hyperechogenic material (pus) can often be appreciated as well.

soldiers of our immune system. Colostrum is specifically high in an antibody called IgG. At birth, the foal's gastrointestinal tract is "open," meaning that the foal can absorb mom's immunoglobulins. Greatest absorption occurs within the first 6 hours and then declines until the gastrointestinal tract closes at 24 hours. This entire process is called passive transfer of immunity. It is important to check a foal's IgG level at about 12 hours following birth to ensure the foal has received adequate immunoglobulins. Adequate levels are >800. Foals with levels below 400 should receive plasma before their gastrointestinal tract closes.

The umbilicus should also be dipped several times after birth in order

to encourage the umbilicus to "dry" and close. Current recommended dipping agents include dilute chlorhexidine or iodine solutions. Ensure the chlorhexidine or iodine is a solution not a scrub. Using agents that are too caustic or dipping too much can cause scalding of the ventral abdomen and may promote patency of the urachus

### Pathogenesis

At birth, the umbilicus breaks, leaving behind a small external remnant and a large internal remnant. Bacteria can invade the large internal remnant through the external remnant, leading to localized infection of one or more of the aforementioned umbilical structures. The bacteria can then get into the bloodstream and cause infection at other sites including the lungs, gastrointestinal tract and joints. When this happens, the foal becomes septic and is very sick.

#### **Clinical Signs**

Clinical signs vary, depending on whether the foal is septic. Generalized non-specific signs include fever, inappetance, depression, or lethargy. Signs specific to infection of the umbilicus (with or without sepsis) include umbilical swelling, purulent discharge, heat and pain. In foals with primary sepsis or sepsis secondary to an infected umbilicus, clinical signs can affect other organ systems. These include difficulty breathing, rapid breathing, diarrhea, colic, swollen joints, lameness,

#### Treatment

Options for treatment include medical management and surgery. Broad spectrum antibiotics should be initiated with either course of treatment. Candidates for medical management are those with localized infection (ie not septic) and those who are not anesthetic/surgical candidates due to other medical conditions. Recheck ultrasound of the affected umbilical structures should be performed every five to seven days to ensure that the treatment is working. If the foal is not responsive to medical therapy, has a large lesion and/ or has multiple structures affected, or has multiple affected organ systems, surgery to remove the infected structures provides the best long-term prognosis.

### Prevention

First line of defense in protecting a foal from any disease, including umbilical infections and sepsis, is to ensure adequate colostrum update. Foals should nurse within 2 hours of birth. The first milk they receive from mom is called colostrum, which is rich in immunoglobulins - the





### **Equine Storage Solutions**

### **Storage Solutions**

As the years pass, barn owner's everywhere have come to know that their buildings shrink. This is not a new phenomenon. Spaces that were once earmarked as simply "tack rooms" hold a host of Equine accessories, from bucket warmers to fly sheets, all of which are very necessary. Even haylofts, once expansive open spaces host season items, and everything but hay. As our disciplines and skill sets evolve, so do our storage needs.

It's not that these spaces have actually "shrunk" in a literal sense. Rather as we grow our Equine business or passion for all things horse, we have to reinvent how we store our necessities. Space comes with a premium in a horse barn. It's often a good idea for horse owners to "inventory" their storage needs, even informally. This exercise should include what you have, where it is stored, and whether those storage items meet your needs. It's also good practice to evaluate what your future storage needs might be.



Traditional "stick built" construction remains a popular means of adding covered storage. For many of us, adding a full scale addition to an existing structure isn't feasible. It can be difficult to find a reputable contractor with availability. Often our land is already in use or we lack the approval from local government for that level of expansion. Not to mention such

hardscape changes are costly. Now more than ever, horse owners instead look toward a la carte options that can add space, but are budget friendly. There is also the added bonus that some storage options can be portable in that they don't have a traditional foundation.



#### Fabric Shed's and Garages

A fabric shed or garage is the perfect "in a box" solution for storing outdoor equipment, ATV's, lawn and garden equipment, small tractors, seasonal items or any kind of bulky storage. All of the styles we researched were water resistant, and featured UV treating to resist fading, mold and mildew. The high grade steel frames offer both durability and portability, in case you needed to move your fabric shed. A wide range of sizes lets you choose something small enough for garden tools or large enough to stow a tractor, horse trailer or truck. Fabric storage is also very budget friendly.



### **Traditional Wooden Sheds**

Many companies offer prebuilt sheds that can be trailered to your location. Like their fabric cousin, they offer design flexibility. However you can also select from a wide range of window, door and ramp configurations to best fit your needs. Aesthetic elements such a cupola, weather vane, or custom vinyl siding can be added. Reeds Ferry Sheds in Hudson, NH offer pricing and descriptions for all of their options online. Traditional wooden sheds can be placed on a variety of surfaces. Your shed installer can help you understand how to prep your surface before the arrival of your new shed. A typical wooden shed can be as small as 6' X 8' or 14' X 24' (and larger). Wooden sheds can be made with higher walls, thicker flooring, and double beams for added agricultural durability.



### Steel and Metal Buildings

Many equine enthusiasts, from a variety of disciplines, look to metal buildings for safe and functional facilities. Metal buildings can be very stylish and withstand the test of time. They are versatile and can offer fabulous storage solutions. In addition, they can also be used as barns, arenas, or a simple "run in" building. Metal buildings take into account functionality, layout, and ventilation. As the size of agricultural machinery increases, storage buildings have also adapted. The Morton brand has a hybrid technology that now allows for clear-span buildings up to 150". From freestyle barns, feed storage, office space or sale barns steel buildings are touch and affordable.

For larger storage needs most fabric, shed or steel building dealers offer financing through their venders, or by partnering with banks and lenders. In fact, rates are very competitive and worth into. Adding coverage storage extends the life of your equipment and adds value to your asset. It's good to plan early as customization, transportation and installation can take more time than one might anticipate. However, reliable and flexible storage is worth the wait

## Tips for Hot Weather Survival The Horse's Maine & NH Staff

**Schedule, schedule:** keep your horse on his regular schedule. Too much change is an invitation for colic. This is a precaution for year-round.

Avoid Sunburn: Keep them out of the direct sunlight during peak hours. White sock, blazes, pink noses or hairless patches form scarring are at greatest risk. Try a scrim sheet and sunblock.

Adequate Shade: Providing a run-in shed is best if not available bring them in during peak hours. Trees are a source of shade, but as the sun moves so does the shade.

**Cooler turn-out times:** Provide cooler turn-out times, overnight is ideal or turn out in the early morning hours and bring them in during midday hear.

Move the air: Fans are a great way to keep the air moving. Be sure your horse can't get a hold of cords, or plugs. Larger isle fans are ideal to keep air moving in the barn.

Provide fresh, cool water, salt and an electrolyte source: Fresh clean water

several times a day, free choice salt and electrolytes. If you choose electrolytes educate yourself or as your vet, too many electrolytes can be harmful.

Slow daily work: In heat lighten your horses work time and intensity. This is important when the heat index is high. Poor quality air restricts your horse oxygen intake.

Clip horses with: Pituitary pars intermedia dysfunction (PPID, or Cushing's disease). Coats provide protection from the sun, but a long, thick coat holds the heat in. Be careful not to clip the hair to close, their hair protects them from damaging rays.

Know signs of heat stroke: Heat know signs of near stroke. Heat stroke can happen in hot conditions including standing in a hot stall or trailer. Know your horse's normal vital signs, temperature, heart and respiratory rates. If you are concerned you horse might have heat stroke call your veterinarian immediately.



Windham. On Thursday, June 20th, despite the heavy downpours, 65 RTT staff and volunteers and family members gathered for RTT's volunteer recognition event at St. Eiboh's on Sebago Lake.
